President's Report: Stephen O'Connell

A. Membership Services Workshop (September 16-17, 2018)

It featured speakers from the broader educational sector. They encouraged us to reach out to all sectors of education and make them feel welcome. Strategies were identified for approaching indigenous educators, early years staff, private school staff and post secondary staff.

B. Governance Workshop (September 23-24, 2018)

Looked at Governance from a committee member's perspective Gave a common base of understanding regarding our new Bylaw and Policies and the operation of all committees within this new structure

C. Presidents' Workshop (October 28-29, 2018)

Engaged District leaders in reviewing initiatives in the RTO/ERO
